The main concern is the arrangements for visitors parking outside our properties and we would therefore like to see the parking restrictions on the single yellow line reduced to allow parking before 8.00am and after 6.00pm Monday to Friday and all restrictions to be removed on Saturdays and Sundays.

Council Response

TRO 4 (2010) PARKING BAY REVIEW - St John's Road

Further to the formal consultation that took place from 30/07/10 – 20/08/10, Slough Borough Council have now made a decision on how best to proceed with the Traffic Regulation Order for waiting restrictions on St Johns Road.

Due to the actual number of dropped crossings that have been implemented as part of the footway improvements, it is not feasible for us to implement the previously proposed scheme as the parking bays would obstruct too many driveways. It is the decision of the council to introduce an amended scheme (as can be seen on the attached plan) which will aim to protect the junctions and allow access for large emergency and refuse vehicles, and leave the rest of the street unrestricted for residents to park. This scheme will be under a 6 month review, and your comments are welcome to inform us on how the scheme is working.

Any resident that currently has a residents parking permit will be eligible for a refund for every full month that remains on the permit. If you would like claim a refund, can you please send your permit back to the following address and a refund will be arranged to be sent to you:
