Buckingham Avenue East and Melbourne Avenue Petition

We the undersigned residents of Buckingham Avenue East and Melbourne Avenue seriously object to the closure of Buckingham Avenue East and ask for a proper consultation meeting to find an appropriate alternative solution to the current over speeding and heavy traffic problems in these roads.

We the residents wish to object to the scheme being introduced as an experimental measure at the site of Northampton Avenue, adjacent to 28 Buckingham Avenue East. This is not what we the residents asked for, so why is the Council forcing this onto us?

This measure will turn Buckingham Avenue East into a boulevard where anti-social behaviour will thrive.

Council Response

Further to a meeting between the local residents of Melbourne Avenue and Buckingham Avenue East and the ward councillor, the Authority received a petition against the proposed experimental measures of the road closure in Northampton Avenue. Due to the majority of households asking for the Authority not to introduce the proposed measures, the Authority has withdrawn the experimental traffic orders for both the road closure and the parking measures.

The Authority will therefore not be introducing the road closure, or any further measures with Melbourne Avenue or Buckingham Avenue East.
