1. Covering Report

- 1.1 A meeting of the Corporate Improvement Scrutiny Committee has been convened at the request of the Chair in response to the <u>Secretary of State's publication</u> of correspondence about the progress of the best value intervention at Slough Borough Council.
- 1.2 The purpose of this meeting is to explore the issues raised in this correspondence and to scrutinise the executive's intended response.
- 1.3 To this end, the Chair has invited the Leader and Cabinet to attend and answer questions, supported by the Chief Executive and Corporate Leadership Team. Commissioners have also been invited, in order to assist the committee with understanding and exploring this issue.
- 1.4 Members are reminded that the <u>Corporate Improvement Scrutiny Committee's</u> terms of reference include sections on the committee's role in:
 - Policy Development;
 - Scrutiny (holding to account); and
 - Improvement Functions.
- 1.5 These include, inter alia:
 - 'Monitor and drive improvement against any Directions by the Secretary of State and other external or internal inspections, reviews, performance information at their own discretion'; and
 - 'Question decision-makers about their decisions and performance, whether generally in comparison with service plans and targets over a period of time or in relation to particular decisions, initiatives or projects'.

1.6 The committee's work programme is created and maintained through a mixture of periodic reviews and continuous monitoring of events. Over the coming months the committee's annual report will be produced and reported to the Annual Council Meeting, and this will inform the committee's annual work programming effort in May/June. As usual, committee members are invited to give consideration to their future work programme while discussing this topic – both in terms of potential one-off items or suggestions for the committee's overall approach to fulfilling its terms of reference.

- ii. That the Committee give consideration to implications or issues for the Corporate Improvement Scrutiny Committee's future work programme.
