WELCOME

Karen Appleby was welcomed as a prospective member on SACRE representing Judaism. Her membership would be officially approved at the next Council meeting.

55. Minutes of the Last Meeting held on 6 October 2021

Resolved - That the minutes of the meeting held on 6 October 2021 be approved as a correct record subject to the following amendments:

- i) Lynda Bussley and Sue Elbrow had not been present at the meeting due to technical issues.
- ii) Lynda Bussley had been appointed as Vice-Chair in her absence.
- iii) Minute 48 – SACRE Finance – 4th para – should read ‘March 2022’.

56. Matters Arising

Lynda Bussley accepted her appointment as Vice-Chair of SACE for 2021-2022.

In response to a query raised at the last meeting, David Rees, the professional (PA) adviser confirmed that faith schools were required to follow an agreed syllabus, but the schools could determine the points they wanted to teach.

(Cllr Basra joined the meeting – 16.36pm)

57. Pan-Berkshire SACRE Hub Minutes of the meeting held on 13 December 2021

Christine Isles provided an update on the Pan-Berkshire SACRE Hub meeting held on 13 December 2021 and reported that a further meeting had taken place on 7 March 2022.

It was highlighted that additional filming programmes had been undertaken at a Catholic Church, Sunni Mosque and Orthodox Synagogue. The notes for Key Stage (KS) 1 and 2 had been completed, but those for KS3 were still ongoing.

(Hardip joined the meeting – 16.40pm)

In relation to the Agreed Syllabus review, 56 responses had been received following consultation with teachers in the local authorities that participated in the Pan-Berkshire Hub. There had therefore been discussions as to whether to convene an Agreed Syllabus Conference (ASC) in each local authority or to postpone the review to 2023 in the spring, summer or autumn, which was the latest time that an ASC could be legally convened.

The approximate sum of £5,000 still remained in the Hub budget, but £1200 had yet to be deducted for the cost of the four additional films, as well as a further cost for writing the notes. Local authorities would be invoiced for their contribution of £900 for 2022-2023. It had been suggested that the remaining money could either be held over to provide up-front funding for the review of the Agreed Syllabus, or to provide training for teachers in preparation of the review.

Resolved – That the update be noted.

58. Pan-Berkshire Hub Minutes of the Meeting held on 7 March 2022

This item was covered in the minute 57 above.

59. SACRE Membership Update

The clerk advised that the membership groups would be updated to include Karen Appleby as a Jewish representative member on SACRE, following her appointment by the Council.

Resolved - That the update be noted.

60. SACRE Spring 2022 RE Newsletter

The professional adviser invited members to submit details of any forthcoming event that they may wish to be included in the SACRE Spring 2022 RE Newsletter by the end of March 2022.

Standing Advisory Council on Religious Education - 09.03.22

Members commended that the termly newsletters were very informative and believed that they provided useful and helpful information and resources to support teachers in schools.

It was explained that information included in the newsletters were steered by the NASACRE, NATRE (National Association of Teachers of Religious Education), feedback that could be shared from various RE groups, as well as the Slough RE Network group. Teachers could also contact the professional adviser on the email address included in the newsletters.

Resolved – That the SACRE Spring 2022 RE Newsletter be noted.

61. Draft Slough Annual SACRE Report 2020-2021

Members received the draft Annual SACRE Report for 2020-2021 set out in the template recommended by NASACRE.

The professional adviser highlighted that NASACRE had advised that a year should be allowed to enable the new SACRE Annual report framework to be embedded in the new format but needed to be agreed by the SACRE.

The report was required to be sent to NASACRE in December, but the deadline had been extended due to Covid-19.

It was noted that there would be additional cost in the preparation of the report due to the level of details/information that was now required to be included. Further details were yet to be included in the report.

Resolved – That further work was on-going on the initial draft and would be reported to the next meeting.

62. SACRE Action Plan - February 2022

The professional adviser presented the 2021-2022 draft Action Plan updated in February 2022.

It was highlighted that the NASACRE annual conference would be held virtually in 2022 and further details were yet to be provided. The next termly RE Network meeting would be held on 17 March 2022 and further details relating to Strictly RE would be included on the agenda.

On-going work continued to be supported including, revisiting the Crossing the Bridges project, which was anticipated would be restarted post Covid-19. Also proposed (subject to further discussion) was arranging an in-house RE Teachers' Conference drawing on the expertise available within the Pan-Berkshire Hub membership.

Members were reassured that there was sufficient funding available to support the various actions set out in the Action Plan.

Resolved – That the SACRE Action Plan – February 2022 be noted.

63. SACRE Finance Update - February 2022

The group manager for school effectiveness provided an update on SACRE finance. Oxford Diocese had been requested to submit an invoice for the remaining £450 from the 2021-22 contributions. There would also be an under spend of approximately £3,000 of the 2021-22 SACRE budget, which would be required to be spent by the end of March 2022.

Members discussed various ways that the surplus budget could be spent including:

- Purchasing artefact to support teachers when teaching RE and drafting support guidance materials. Schools in Slough that taught RE would be invited to place an order from the RE Online catalogue for the sum of approximately £80 to purchase support materials of relevance to their teaching. Invoices to be made to the Council for payment to be made from the SACRE budget. The professional adviser would explore the proposal with a view to progressing prior to the end of March 2022, and the group manager for school effectiveness confirmed that the RE Online catalogue would be sent by email to headteachers in Slough.
- Begin preparation for drafting written materials for the proposed RE Teachers' conference.

It was stressed that any sum over £2,000 would require approval by the Finance Committee.

Also discussed was the suggestion that given the Council's current financial situation, consideration should be given to give back any surplus. It was noted that the SACRE budget was derived from the Education and the DSG budget, all of which were closely being monitored as part of the Council's financial management control.

Resolved:

- i) That schools in Slough be invited to order up to approximately £80 worth of RE artefacts from the RE Online catalogue before the end of March 2022.
- ii) That any unspent surplus remaining by the end March 2022 be absorbed by the Council.

64. SACRE Membership News (An update from members regarding activities undertaken since the last SACRE meeting)

Lynda Bussley (Vice-Chair) reported that St Mary's Church was hosting a Queens Jubilee Lunch at Upton Court Chalvey on 5 June 2022. It was noted that 5 June was also a Thank You Day and a walk had been organised by faith groups.

Resolved – That the updates be noted.

The SACRE noted that teaching diversity at KS1 in schools had been recommended in the Strictly RE newsletter. The professional adviser would provide further details once they were available.

Pan-Berkshire Hub

A reminder that the SACRE website for the Berkshire hub was set up last year– the idea is for this to be a site holding certain resources for teachers including the ‘**Crossing the Bridges**’ database of places of worship. SACRE is often asked about arranging visits and/or having visitors into school to help bring the world of RE to life a little more. Real People, Real Faith – This was a series of interviews filmed in locations across Berkshire, featuring local faith communities answering questions about their faith. Two questions, specific to each key stage were asked across the range of venues and in most venues, several people answered each question. This allowed pupils and teachers to explore some of the diversity both between and within faith communities. The same six communities were interviewed at each key stage. Each film has a page of notes outlining the key questions and concepts, with a brief summary of the answers and some suggested follow-on activities.

The video clips are also housed on the NATRE website as well as in the pan Berkshire hub website

The questions answered are as follows

KS1

- What Symbols are important to you?
- What stories are important to you?

KS2

- How special is your relationship with God?
- How does your belief in God affect your daily life?

KS3

- In what ways do science, belief and religion interact and what difference might this make?
- Why might it matter that sacred texts are open to interpretation?

Further interviews with other religion and worldview communities have been recorded, hopefully these will be made available soon. There are also plans for more interviews to be filmed soon.

SACRE would like to encourage you to use these resources in the classroom. It would be really helpful to hear how these are being used. Are they used as starters or as part of looking at the lived experience side of RE? The **recent Ofsted RE subject review** strongly encouraged engaging with people from religion and worldview communities so these clips could certainly contribute towards this. Please contact David to let SACRE know how the clips are being used and offer any other suggestions you might have about how they could be used.

- The **Strictly RE conference** took place at the end of January 2022 with over 400 teachers attending the virtual event over a weekend – many of the excellent sessions were recorded and can still be accessed via the NATRE
