## **Paper Petition Details**

## Parking in Littlebrook Avenue

We have been concerned for about 2 years about the cars which park during the day at the southern end of our road so that their occupants can walk to and from Burnham Station. They are a safety hazard for several reasons (besides making driving on that stretch difficult).

- 1) On several occasions the cars have prevented the refuse lorry getting into the car park for the flats numbered 137-153. This means rubbish can be left for 2 or more weeks which is a health hazard. The same problem could affect the 2 other entrances to the Haymill Rise flats (83-99, and 101-136) and entrances to many other blocks of flats and groups of houses in the road.
- 2) Clearly if the refuse lorry can't get in, Emergency Services would also have a problem accessing the fronts of the flats or houses which are set back from the road via these entrances.
- 3) When parked cars in the road leave only a narrow gap for cars exiting the car parks, the visibility from the driver's seat is virtually nil. The only way to get out is by inching forward and hoping anything coming along the road stops or avoids your car.

We appeal to Slough Borough Council to mark the road in some way to prevent the station parkers from blocking our entrances and making them dangerous. If the yellow lines proposed in February were unacceptable to some, perhaps less invasive white 'keep clear' access bar markings could be painted on the road at the entrances, ensuring that access to and from these flats and houses are not obstructed. At proper junctions there should also be yellow lines on the comers. This will still leave room for some cars to park safely in the road where residents or visitors need extra parking.
